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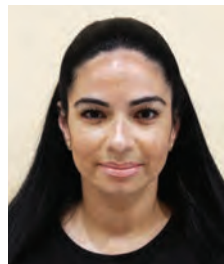

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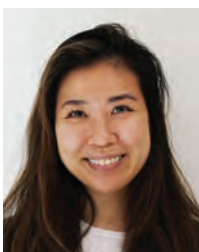

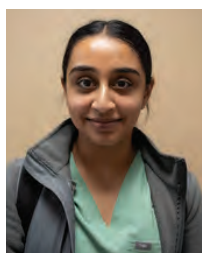

DENTAL MEDICINE PRIVILEGES

DELINEATION OF SURGICAL PRIVILEGES FOR POST GRADUATE RESIDENTS

Eligibility to perform hospital procedures must be based on an individual's education, training, and demonstrated competency.

Surgical Privileges for Post Graduate Residents are divided into three (3) categories.

CATEGORY I

Privileges in this category are:

- To admit, consult, diagnose, evaluate comprehensive oral health needs, and provide dental diagnosis.
- To asses, stabilize and determine disposition of patients with emergent oral/dental conditions consistent with medical staff policy regarding emergency consultative call services
- When doubt exists as to the diagnosis, or in cases in which improvement from treatment is not soon apparent, practitioner will contact the Chief Resident and/or the Attending Physician.

Simple excision of cysts and minor benign tumors from the oral cavity and associated structures (<u>not</u> including segmental or major resection)	
Fabrication and placement of oral appliances	
Taking Dental and Facial impressions	
Diagnostic radiology (intra-oral, extra-oral radiography) of the patient	
Periodontal assessment of patient

Preventive Dentistry/ Outreach	
Repair of Lacerations (intra-oral)

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Category II

Privileges in this category include those in Category I, plus specific surgical conditions and procedures of increased scope and complexity which may require Local Anesthesia, but which do not constitute an immediate or serious threat to life. Practitioners with these privileges are expected to request consultation where expected improvement is not soon apparent and when specialized therapeutic or diagnostic techniques are indicated.

Additional Category II privileges may be granted to those practitioners who have successfully demonstrated skills in this particular category. **In this category, O.R. privileges are only granted under the supervision of an attending physician.**

Comprehensive dental rehabilitation of patients with mental or physical disability under general anesthesia (O.R.)	
Comprehensive dental rehabilitation of patients who are medically compromised under general anesthesia (O.R.)	

CATEGORY III

Privileges of this category included those in category I and Category II, plus those associated with complex injuries or deformities of the head and neck. **In this category, O.R. privileges are only granted under the supervision of an attending physician.** The following privileges comprise category III.

Comprehensive management of pediatric and adolescent dent alveolar trauma including re-implantations and stabilization of avulsed permanent dentition	

CATEGORY IV

Privileges of this category include those in category I, II and III, plus the access and utilize advanced internal and external fixation devices to the lower extremity. **In this category, O.R. Privileges are only granted under the supervision of an attending physician.**

Comprehensive orthodontic therapy for patient including full mouth fixed appliance therapy

Assessment and comprehensive treatment of patients with craniofacial anomalies with prosthetic devices
