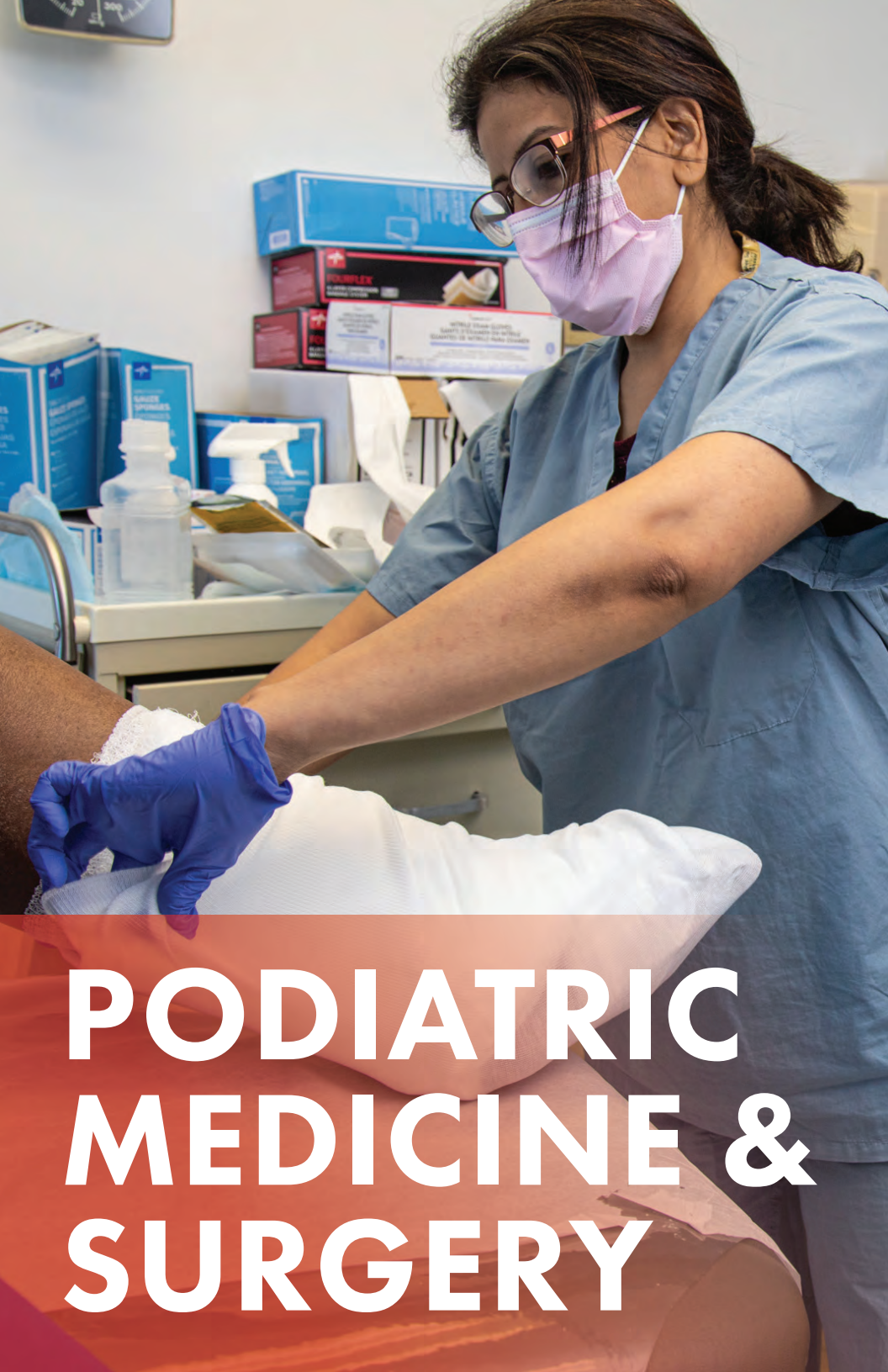

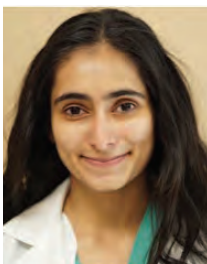

DELINEATION OF SURGICAL PRIVILEGES FOR POST GRADUATE TRAINEES

Practitioner _____ Level _____

Eligibility to perform hospital procedures must be based on an individual's education, training, and demonstrated competency.

Surgical Privileges Post Graduate Trainees are divided into three (3) categories.

CATEGORY I

Privileges in this category are for uncomplicated podiatric illness or problems which present no serious threat to limb or life. When doubt exists as to the diagnosis, or in cases in which improvement from treatment is not soon apparent, practitioner will contact the Attending Physician.

Category I privileges may be granted to physicians without formal surgical training based on documented evidence that such privileges comprise category I.

In this category, O.R. privileges are only granted under the supervision of an attending surgeon. The following privileges comprise category I.

	Approved
History and Physical	
Changes of Dressing	
Drawing of Routine Blood	
Removal of foreign body in the foot by forceps or superficial incision	
Incision and drainage of an abscess of the foot	
Suture of laceration of the foot (simple)	
Staple and Suture removal	
Simple debridement of foot wound	
Assistance at surgery under direct supervision of attending surgeon, e.g. O.R., Clinics, and Emergency Room

CATEGORY II

Privileges in this category include those in Category I, plus specific surgical conditions and procedures of increased scope and complexity which may require Local Anesthesia, but which do not constitute an immediate or serious threat to life or limb. Practitioners with these privileges are expected to request consultation where expected improvement is not soon apparent and when specialized therapeutic or diagnostic techniques are indicated.

Category II privileges may be granted to those practitioners who have successfully demonstrated skills in this particular category. **In this category, O.R. privileges are only granted under the supervision of an attending physician.** The following privileges comprise category II.

Simple closed fracture management of the foot	
Treatment of closed dislocations of the foot	
Application of compression or dressing splint	
Application of a cast	
Blood Culture	
IM Injection	
Removal of superficial implants (K-wire)	
Percutaneous injection	
Application of traction	
Nail surgery under local anesthesia	
Removal of cast	
Venipuncture and start of I.V. infusion, Blood transfusion

Intubation as an emergency	

CATEGORY III

Privileges of this category includes those in Category I and Category II, plus those associated with complex injuries or deformities of the foot. The following privileges comprise category III.

	Approved
Gunshot wounds of the foot	
Severe degloving injuries or major trauma of the foot	
Closed reduction of rear foot fractures and dislocations
