THE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

Wyckoff Heights Medical Center offers a one-year ASHP-accredited PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program. This program provides a variety of learning opportunities at an established teaching hospital located in a diverse neighborhood in Brooklyn, NY. The program's primary goals are to equip the resident with the knowledge, skills, confidence, and abilities to provide care in a direct patient care setting. In this program, the resident will train under a passionate and expert pharmacy faculty, in a multidisciplinary team to provide comprehensive medication therapy management across a broad spectrum of medical populations.

PGY1 pharmacy residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives. Residents who successfully complete PGY1 residency programs will be skilled in diverse patient care, practice management, leadership, and education, and be prepared to provide patient care, seek board certification in pharmacotherapy (i.e., BCPS), and pursue advanced education and training opportunities including postgraduate year two (PGY2) residencies.
