THE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

Wyckoff Heights Medical Center offers a one-year ASHP-accredited PGY2 Pharmacy Residency Program in Internal Medicine. This program provides a variety of learning opportunities at an established teaching hospital located in a diverse neighborhood in Brooklyn, New York. In this program, the resident will build their knowledge, skills, and confidence by working under passionate and expert pharmacy faculty in a multidisciplinary team, providing comprehensive medication therapy management across a broad spectrum of medicine populations.

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency training to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives for advanced practice areas. Residents who successfully complete PGY2 residency programs are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, and board certification in the advanced practice area, if available.
